

2011 S.A. PENNY WARS

Donation & Contest Rules

- 1. To raise money for the 2011-2012 NJASC State Charity, "Good Grief, we will be collecting pennies from Monday September 26 to Wednesday October 12.** Each homeroom will receive a 2-liter homeroom collection bottle, in which students should try and deposit as many pennies as possible. ONLY PENNIES MAY BE DEPOSITED INTO THE HOMEROOM COLLECTION BOTTLES!
- 2. When your homeroom collection bottle fills up, please send it to B-16 immediately.** We will replace it with a new empty bottle so that your homeroom may continue to donate pennies. Each 2-liter bottle holds approximately 3000 pennies. Last year, one homeroom actually filled TEN bottles!
- 3. As bottles come in, we will count the pennies collected.** Using Commerce Bank to count the pennies, we will update and announce the grade and homeroom counts daily. We will continue to replace homeroom bottles until Wednesday October 12, when all bottles will be collected. We will try to announce the final results – the Spirit Point winning grade, and the winning homerooms in each grade by Monday October 17.
- 4. Our goal is to surpass the all-time record of 303,487 pennies!** Your incentives, other than true selfless charity, are as follows:
 - *The homeroom in each grade that donates the most pennies per person will win a FREE PIZZA PARTY during their regular lunch period.*
 - *The grade that has the highest overall penny count (see below) at the end of the Penny Wars will win 15 SPIRIT POINTS!*
 - *If the goal is surpassed, the color of Mr. Miller's hair will change – based on the actual number of pennies collected. See the hallway flyers at any "Brooklawn S.A...Everywhere" location or the Penny Wars page at www.BrooklawnSA.org for more details.*
- 5. From October 3-12, there will be one Fight Back Bottle for each grade in the cafetorium.** Only NICKELS, DIMES, QUARTERS, and DOLLAR COINS may be deposited into these bottles – NO PAPER MONEY is allowed! Each coin deposited will TAKE AWAY its value from the penny count for the grade level of the bottle that it is placed in. The idea is to reduce the penny count as much as possible for the other grades, while continuing to increase your own by depositing pennies in your homeroom bottle.
 - *Example: An 8th Grader throws a quarter into the 6th grade Fight Back Bottle. This will REDUCE the 6th grade Penny Count by 25!*
 - *All money deposited in the Fight Back Bottles will also be donated to the 2011-2012 NJASC State Charity, "Good Grief".*
