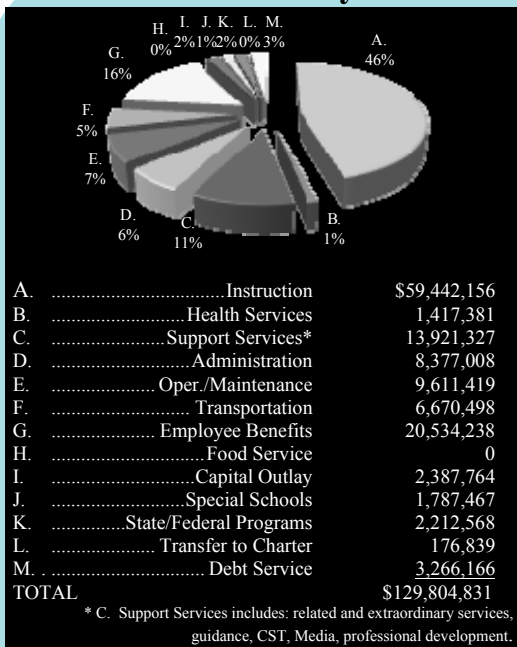
- ☑ Our school district's excellent reputation increases real estate values in our community.

### The 2011-2012 Budget...

- ☑ Contains an .8% tax increase that is **1.2% BELOW** the increase permitted by New Jersey's Tax Levy Cap
- ☑ Maintains **ALL** current programs including **Full-Day Kindergarten, Music, Art, AP Courses, GRO**
- ☑ Maintains **ALL** industrial and fine arts including band, choral, and drama programs
- ☑ Maintains **ALL** current athletic programs including middle school sports, high school interscholastic sports including freshman teams
- ☑ Reduces administrative costs that are **29% LESS** than permitted by the New Jersey Department of Education

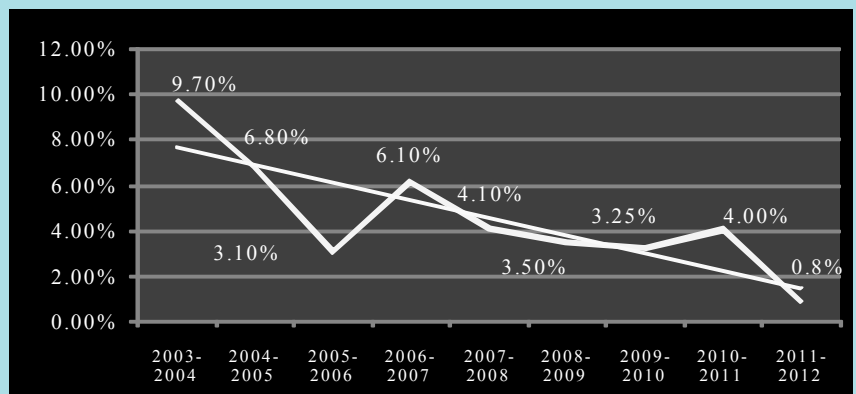
